Let's Celebrate

May Day (May 1) celebrates the return of spring! From surprise flower baskets to the maypole. Don't forget to wash your face with morning dew on May 1st for good luck.

Cinco de Mayo in 2024 falls on Sunday, May 5th. It's a day that celebrates the defeat of the French army during the Battle of Puebla in Mexico on May 5th, 1862. This victory is not to be confused with Mexico's Independence Day, which is actually celebrated on September 16th. Cinco de Mayo is a day of Mexican pride and heritage, particularly for people with Mexican backgrounds living in the United States. Many cities in the southwestern regions of the USA, such as Los Angeles, San Jose, San Francisco, San Antonio, Sacramento, Phoenix, Albuquerque, Denver, and El Paso, host large celebrations. These festivities often include traditional Mexican music, dancing, and delicious food and drinks. While it's not a federal holiday, it's a day to appreciate Mexican culture and achievements!

Mother's Day (May 12th) is a holiday honoring motherhood that is observed in different forms throughout the world. In the United States, Mother's Day 2024 falls on Sunday, May 12th. The American incarnation of Mother's Day was created by Anna Jarvis in 1908 and became an official U.S. holiday in 1914. Jarvis would later denounce the holiday's commercialization and spent the latter part of her life trying to remove it from the calendar. While dates and celebrations vary, Mother's Day traditionally involves presenting moms with flowers, cards and Gifts!

Memorial Day (May 27th)

Is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. Memorial Day 2024 will occur on Monday, May 27th.

Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971. Many Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings and participating in parades. Unofficially, it marks the beginning of the summer season.
